Blue-green algae can produce toxins, which can be harmful to humans and pets.



Blooms are often green in color.



Blooms may appear on the surface of the water as scum or a floating mat.



Blooms may produce unpleasant odors.

IF YOU SEE A BLUE-GREEN ALGAL BLOOM

People and pets should stay out of the water.



Do not swim, wade or walk in the water.



Do not let pets swim or go near the water.



Rinse fish with tap water. Throw out guts.



Do not use water from this site for drinking or cooking.



Do not eat shellfish.
